

PURPOSE Guidance for air medical use

## BACKGROUND

Policy statement replaces previous special protocol with the adoption of the current NYS Collaborative protocols

Air Medical Transport should be considered for the following:

- Anytime a patient outcome could be improved by shortened transport time or advanced level of care such as:
  - Ground transport greater than 30 minutes;
  - Prolonged extrication;
  - A remote or wilderness area, difficult terrain, or any other time when ground ambulance access is prevented or delayed;
  - Multiple critical / unstable patients / multiple casualty incident;
  - To bring special medical personnel and equipment to the scene, such as a physician or surgeon;
  - ALS level care is otherwise unavailable
  - Patients in need of transport to a specialty center, who are within the time frame for improved outcome (Stroke, STEMI, Trauma, Burns, Etc.)
- Request for Air Medical Service should be made immediately when one of the above criteria is met.
- Patient transport should not be delayed waiting for a helicopter. Begin transport to the hospital and rendezvous with the helicopter, if possible, at a predetermined safe landing site.
- Request for air medical can be made by any responding emergency personnel, cancellations should be made by the highest trained EMS provider on scene.
- All requests should be routed through the appropriate county 911 center, who will contact the clearing house for availability of the closest aircraft.

## • Key Point/Considerations

Incident command system should be utilized to request aircraft when responding to a Motor Vehicle Crash or Multiple Casualty scene.
